

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### **Preface by Giuliana Barbano**

This book got started with a request from Aracne. In 2007, I curated an exhibition of architectural projects carried out by architects from Europe who were AIA Continental Europe chapter members. The projects, including Murat's, were exhibited at Build Up Expo: Architecture and Building Exhibition in Milan, Italy and at the Polytechnic University of Turin's School of Architecture, also in Italy. All of the participating architects' professional work was published in a book edited by myself titled 'Architetti Americani in Europa'.

Ten years after these exhibitions and the publication, Murat asked me to work with him on this book as a means of demystifying the process of creative thinking that he uses in his professional life. 


